After welcoming the core group members, Mr. Gerald of NCRC asked the members whether we need a core group. The members responded by citing the benefits of having a core group:

- Common issues could be addressed
- Helps to know the activities of other NGOs
- Core group could complement individual NGOs' activities
- Common platform for sharing and learning
- Capacity building platform for all the NGOs
- A forum to mobilize resources
- Larger area of coverage possible
- Better outreach: to parents; to teachers and to the authorities

Clarifications sought:

- Should the core group cover tsunami affected areas or unaffected areas too?
- If the focus is on non-tsunami affected areas, who is going to cover the other areas?
- How long the NGOs working currently will remain?
- How to bring in neutrality when NGOs with different approach and perspectives come in?

Representative from CREATE, while supporting the idea of covering other areas too, said that children facing similar issues in unaffected areas are getting discriminated as we our focus is limited to tsunami affected alone

Suggestions came up like when we talk about children's right, a district level perspective would be useful

It was also suggested to meet other NGOs who working in unaffected areas
Also the Core committee should maintain linkages with all the government committees

Decision taken

- The target group will be all the children in the district
- A forum would be evolved wherein new NGOs can come and register- membership will not be restricted to tsunami affected areas but the entire district
- The core focus of the forum will be children and will promote the formation of a Child secretariat.
- A code of conduct and byelaws will be evolved for the forum and the NGOs joining the forum have to abide by this
- The forum will have a separate identity and will not be under NCRC banner

Mr. Kannayiram of UNICEF quoted his Calcutta experience where a secretariat had been formed for the children and is aligned to the municipality and is working well.

Ms. Sitalakshmi of Phoenix federation referred to a few other coordinating mechanisms working well in other areas-

Ms. Annie, C.E.O suggested that 3-5 members can go for an exposure visit to these places. The other members agreed to this and added that this group should take the responsibility of drawing up Nagapattinam specific guidelines.

The members discussed on giving an organizational structure to the core group and towards this the members suggested the formation of an executive committee with 5-7 members for drafting guidelines and bye-laws for the core group. The implementing NGOs will be the members of the executive committee.

The core group members suggested representatives from the following NGOs for the executive committee:

5. Good shepherd
6. Vanavil Trust
7. LCI

Functions of the executive committee

- Study the possibilities of evolving a formal structure
- Study similar structures outside
- Draft the rules and regulations

The study report will be sent to all NGOs to get their feed back

Mr. Gerald of NCRC was selected as the convener of the executive committee

Retrospection on the core group- in the wake of core group completing one year

The members shared their experience on the changes they have observed among the approach of NGOs since the last Children's day celebration. While appreciating each others commitment and sincerity, the members noted the synergies of working together. The members said there has been a perceptible change in the approach of NGOs wherein the individual priorities have given way to an approach of 'working together for a common cause'.

The merits and demerits of having a formal set-up came up for discussion. Everyone felt that having an informal set up gave the smaller NGOs space to voice their views and play a key role in decision making. On the other hand, there was a common feeling that having proper systems and roles will ensure transparency and will give the group a proper direction.

A **SWOT** (Strength, Weakness, Opportunities, Threat) analysis was carried out: The groups identified the following strengths and weaknesses of the core group:
